The community (Stampfer, 124 gives some information about it (genders and 16 infants under the age of one year. 116 Jews with 10 infants lived in the town of Lysiec itself, while the rest (55) were dispersed in the surrounding villages according to the following breakdown:

Drohomirczany - 8 (and one infant)

. Only Kamionki Wielkie *powiat* The Lysiec Jewish community was one of the smallest in the Kołomyia (56) and Kułaczkowce (150) had smaller Jewish populations.
