Hebrew courses of the *Tarbut* school network operated during the interwar period. Children studied there three times a week after they finished classes in the official Polish school. The first teacher was <u>Stoller</u>, later came <u>Konorowsky</u> and in the end, <u>Schochat</u> (Giza Petranker, "The Hebrew Scholl 'Tarbut' of Nadworna," <u>Sefer Nadvurna</u>, 50 [English part], 85 [Hebrew part]). In 1933, there were 30 students in the courses, but their number decreased by 1938 (<u>Pinkas Hakehilot</u>, 329).

A <u>Jewish public library</u> existed in Nadworna before the First World War. It was reopened after the war and included about 2,000 volumes in Polish, Yiddish and Hebrew. The <u>Yehudiyah</u> organization operated an amateur drama group in the town (<u>Pinkas Hakehilot</u>, 329). Almost all political bodies organized lectures and entertainment for local Jews. Likewise, two sport clubs, <u>Ha-koah</u> (Power) and <u>Maccabi</u>, existed in Nadworna. "*Ha-koah*" flourished in the 1930s, especially its soccer team (Israel Grauer, "'Ha-koah' be-nadvorna," <u>Sefer Nadvurna</u>, 86; <u>Pinkas Hakehilot</u>, 329).

After World War I, the president of the local Jewish community was Moshe Budner, who enjoyed the support of the craftsmen association <u>Yad Harutsim</u>. After he left political activity (ca. 1930), his place as the president was taken by his son, <u>Dr. Yosef Budner</u>, also with the support of the <u>Yad Harutsim</u> (Yosef Budner, "Kehilat nadvorna," <u>Sefer Nadvurna</u>, 16). In the elections of 1938, the "Bourgeois Bloc" of centrist Zionist parties defeated the "Democratic Bloc" of Jewish left-wing parties. As a result, <u>Dr. Michael Sterer</u> became the president of the Jewish community council (Budner, "Kehilat nadvorna," <u>Sefer Nadvurna</u>, 16).

Eighteen Jews were elected to the town council in 1927 (Pinkas Hakehilot, 330).
